Canadian Internment Operations of 1914-1920

Many Canadians do not know about Canada's first national internment operations of 1914 – 1920, where thousands of civilians were imprisoned as enemy aliens in 24 concentration camps across Canada. Of the 8,579 “enemy aliens” that were incarcerated in Canada, Ukrainians made up the majority, but also affected were Armenians, Bulgarians, Croatians, Czechoslovakians, Hungarians, Serbians and Turks.

Join Dr. Anton Minkov, a member of the Endowment Council of Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund, as he presents a brief account of this little-known page of Canada's history with a particular emphasis on the Ukrainian and Bulgarian communities.

Fr. Maxym Lysack, Ph.D., will also share a testimony concerning the internment of Ukrainians, among whom were members of his own family from Bukovyna.
